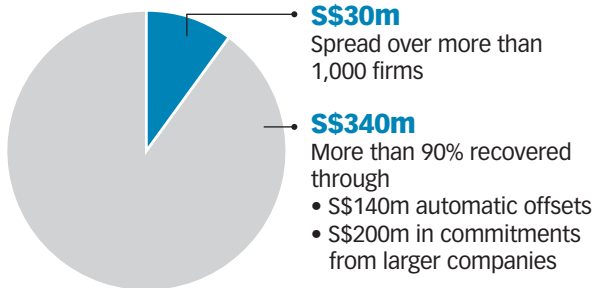


Erroneous payouts

Excess JSS payouts of S\$370m



1,100 businesses identified for additional JSS payouts, amounting to S\$5.5m

Implications for FW levy waiver & rebate:

Excess FW levy waiver and rebate to be recovered	\$1.2m granted to 360 businesses in June and July 2020
Businesses eligible for additional FW levy waiver and rebate	\$6m to be granted to about 1,200 businesses

Reopening timeline

Announcement of circuit breaker

April 3



May 5

First businesses to benefit were traditional Chinese medicine providers. Opening of home-based food businesses, selected food retail outlets and food manufacturing firms followed a week after. Hairdressers and barber shops allowed to provide basic services.

Phase 2

June 19 to Dec 27

Gradual reopening of more firms and services, including F&B dine-in and retail outlets, gym and fitness studios, tuition and enrichment centres. Sports, recreation and outdoor facilities start to reopen.



Circuit Breaker

April 7 to May 4

Most workplaces closed, except for those providing essential services. Schools moved to full home-based learning. This was subsequently extended until June 1.

Phase 1

June 2 to June 18

Businesses allowed to resume operations include manufacturing firms. Hairdressers and barbers allowed to offer all services beyond basic haircuts. Resumption of motor vehicle servicing, aircon servicing, printing services, basic pet services.

Phase 3

Dec 28 to present

Pilot programme to reopen karaokes and nightclubs announced in November 2020 but subsequently put on hold due to a spike in community cases.
